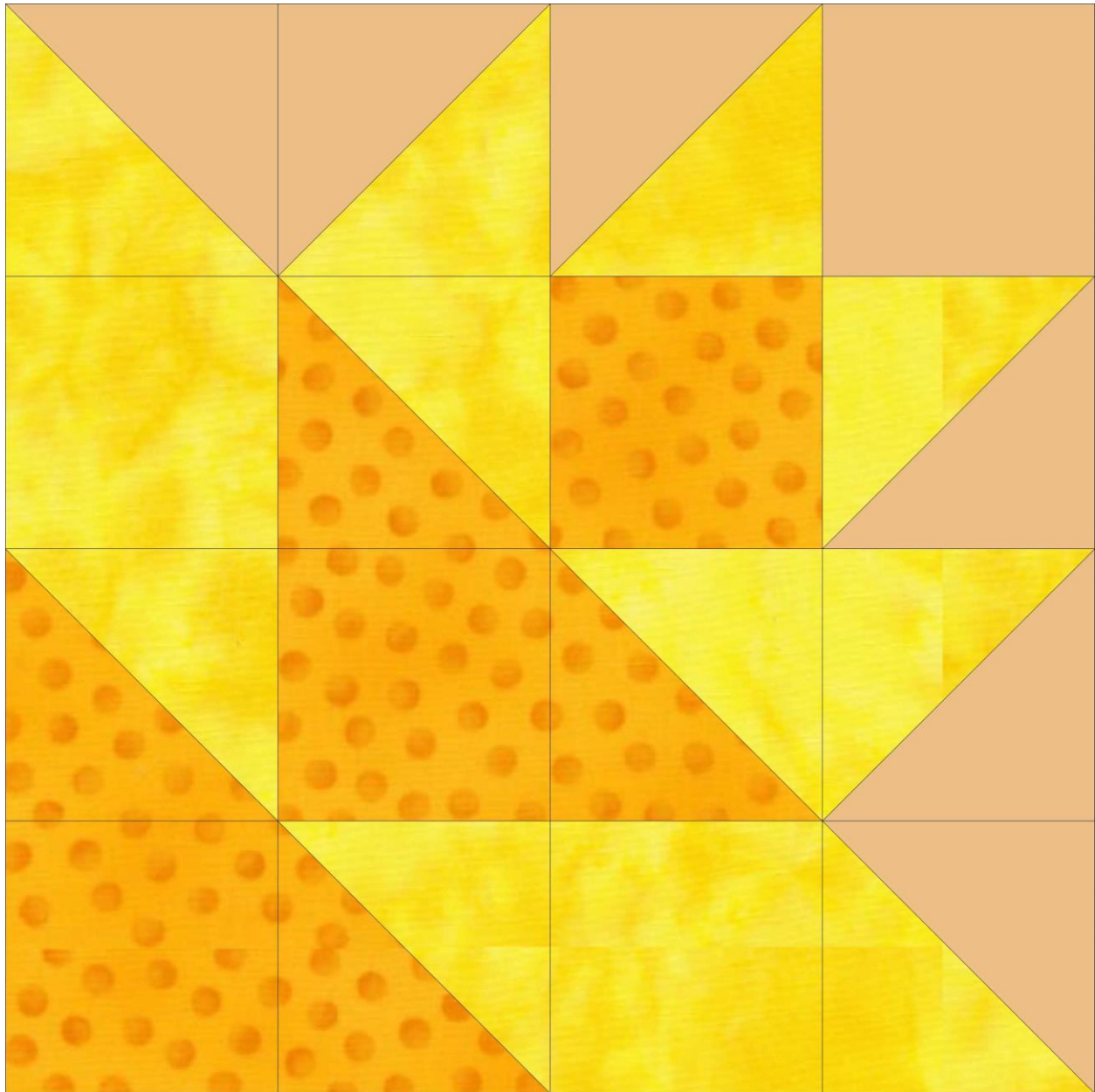
## HST Pieced Wheat Block



**Half Square Triangle Wheat Block Pattern 12" Block**

Block Diagram

### Cutting:

Cut Five: 3 7/8" squares of yellow

Cut Three: 3 7/8" squares of tan

Cut Two: 3 7/8" squares of orange

Cut One: 3.5" square of tan

Cut Two: 3.5" squares of yellow

Cut Three: 3.5" squares of orange

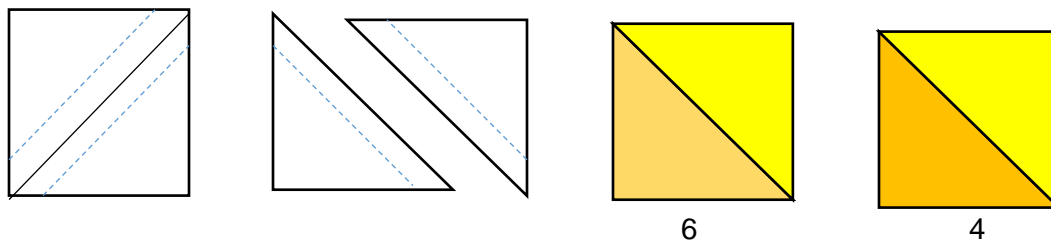
### Making the Half Square Triangles:

**Note:** Use a scant quarter inch seam (just a thread smaller than a quarter inch)

Pair up three yellow and tan 3 7/8" squares and draw diagonal lines on the back of one of each pair.

Pair up two yellow and orange 3 7/8" squares and draw diagonal lines on the back of one of each pair.

Sew 1/4" on either side of the drawn lines. Cut on the lines and press the seams to one side.



You will now have six yellow/tan HSTs and four yellow orange HSTs. Trim off the dog ear corners.

Layout your block as shown in the block diagram and press rows in opposite directions to create nesting seams.

Sew the four rows together and press seams in one direction.

Your block should be 12.5 inches square unfinished and 12" finished in a quilt.

This block represents the abundant wheat our Canadian farmers produce.
