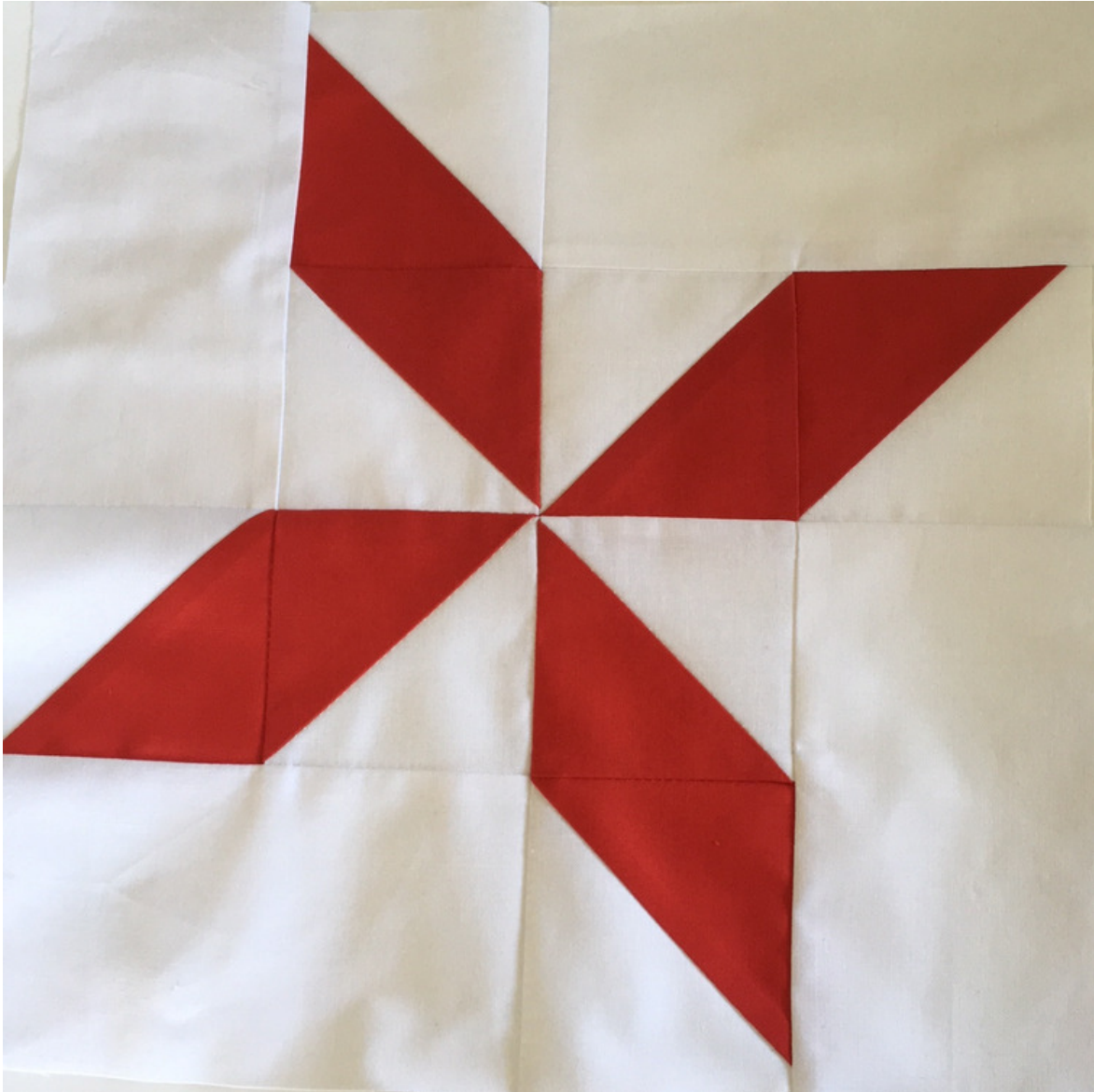

Wind Power Block



Wind Power Block Pattern 12" Block

For Canadian Summer Quilt Along

Cutting:

Cut Four: 3 7/8" squares of white

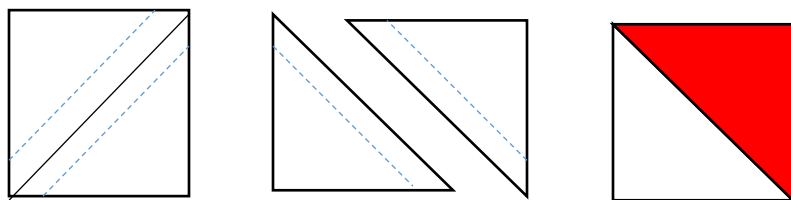
Cut Four: 3 7/8 squares of red (or colour of your choice)

Cut Four: 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles of white

Making the Half Square Triangles:

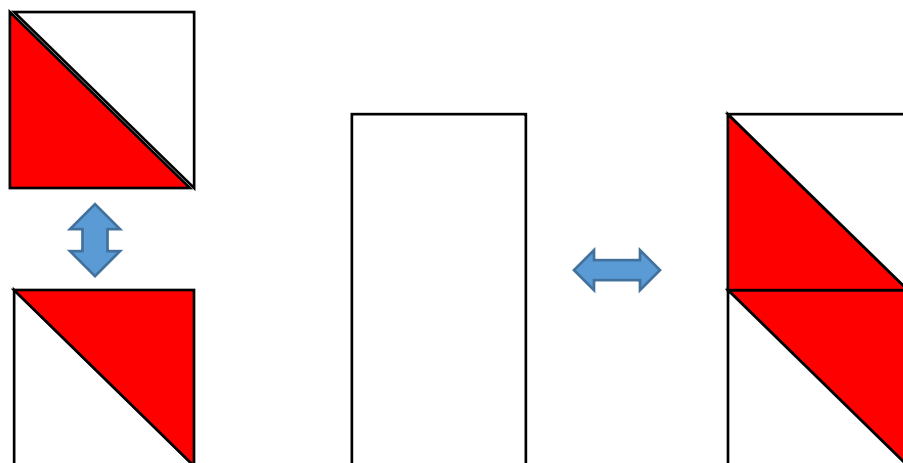
Pair up white and red 3 7/8" squares and draw diagonal lines on the back of one of each pair.

Sew 1/4" on either side of the drawn lines. Cut on the lines and press the seams to the red.



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You will now have eight red/white HSTs. Trim off the dog ear corners.



Sew Two HSTs together as show above and then sew to a 3 ½" x 6 ½" white rectangle. Make 4. Layout your block referring to the pattern cover photo and sew these four units together pressing seams in opposite directions.

Your block should be 12.5 inches square unfinished and 12" finished in a quilt.
